What is Positive Behavior Support?

PBS is a collaborative, assessment-based approach to developing effective interventions for problem behavior. The program emphasizes the use of proactive, educative, and reinforcement-based strategies to achieve meaningful and durable behavior and lifestyle outcomes.



The aim of Positive Behavior Support is to build effective environments in which **positive** behavior is more effective than problem behavior.

Classroom Expectations:

- Listen and respect other's ideas, and work with team members
- Listen quietly while speaker is talking
- Keep hands, feet, and objects to self
- Arrive on time and ready with all supplies
- Share ideas, follow through, and allow teacher to teach

Cafeteria Expectations:

- Use inside voices
- Raise hand for help
- Stay seated
- Use table manners
- Leave area clean
- Line up in line order

Playground Expectations:

- Share equipment
- Follow game rules
- Use equipment safely
- Stand on sand
- Keep hands, feet, and objects to self
- Line up promptly

Car Dismissal Expectations:

- Use quiet voice
- Keep hands, feet, and objects to self
- Sit in assigned area
- Listen for your name
- Watch for your car
- Load when signaled

PBS Student Recognition

Classes are awarded a Panther Paws behavior slip after each lunch/recess period and all related arts classes. The class can earn a #1 (wow!) for following all of the school expectations. A #2 (good) will be awarded as the class demonstrates many of the expectations. The class will score a #3 (keep trying) if the majority of the expectations are not followed. For each #1 the class earns, a tally mark will be added to their classroom Panther Pride Record chart. Upon completion of the entire chart, the class will be congratulated on the morning news, as well as rewarded with a class treat.

In addition, individual students are recognized for following school/classroom expectations by receiving "PAWSOME" Student awards from faculty and staff members. One copy is sent home for parental information, while the duplicate copy is placed into a school-wide box for a weekly prize drawing.

Classroom teachers also implement reward systems within their individual classrooms which further reinforce LPE's positive behavior expectations.
