Lesson Plan for Teaching Expectations (concept level)

1. Expectation (Concept) Act Responsible

2. Definition and Critical Attributes

Able to be trusted or depended upon - Behavior that shows good decision making, good judgment and self-control.

3. Examples

Being prepared to learn.
Following rules.
Being a role model.

3. Non-Examples

Being unprepared.
Running in hall or class
Lying or cheating

4. Activities to Enhance Concept Development

Students will write a story about a responsible person.

5. Activities to Check for Understanding

Present examples and non-examples students will identify

6. Activities to Extend Concept Development

Students can keep track of a partner's responsible actions.

Lesson Plan for Teaching Expectations (concept level)

1. Expectation (Concept) Be Respectful

2. Definition and Critical Attributes

To show consideration: Behaviors that promote cooperation, friendship, and a calm environment.

3. Examples

- Listen when others are speaking
- Ask permission to use other's properly
- Show kindness to others

3. Non-Examples

- Speaking out of turn
- Taking things that don't belong to you
- Being rude-name calling

4. Activities to Enhance Concept Development

Role play examples and non-examples

5. Activities to Check for Understanding

- Students will create their own role play.
- Students will categorize a group of examples and non-examples.

6. Activities to Extend Concept Development

Student can create a class book of examples of being respectful based on their own actions in class or home.

Lesson Plan for Teaching Expectations (concept level)

1. Expectation (Concept) Care for Others

2. Definition and Critical Attributes

To show concern: Behaviors that show acts of kindness towards others.

3. Examples

- Help pick up items
- Praise or compliment peers
- Show concern when others upset

3. Non-Examples

- Laugh at someone that dropped something
- Make fun of someone
- Laugh or ignore
- Excluding others

4. Activities to Enhance Concept Development

Role play – examples and non-examples
Books about friendship, caring, compassion

5. Activities to Check for Understanding

Make a book of examples
Write stories on friendship

6. Activities to Extend Concept Development

- Connections to home
- Hurricane relief project
- Cards/Letters to nursing homes

3. Examples

- Take time to neatly & correctly complete work.

- Hand in sloppy, incomplete work.
- Negative comments to adults or peers

- Compliment jar, caught doing your best

5. Activities to Check for Understanding

- Role play examples and non-examples

6. Activities to Extend Concept Development

- Develop buddy system to help each other to achieve personal goals
